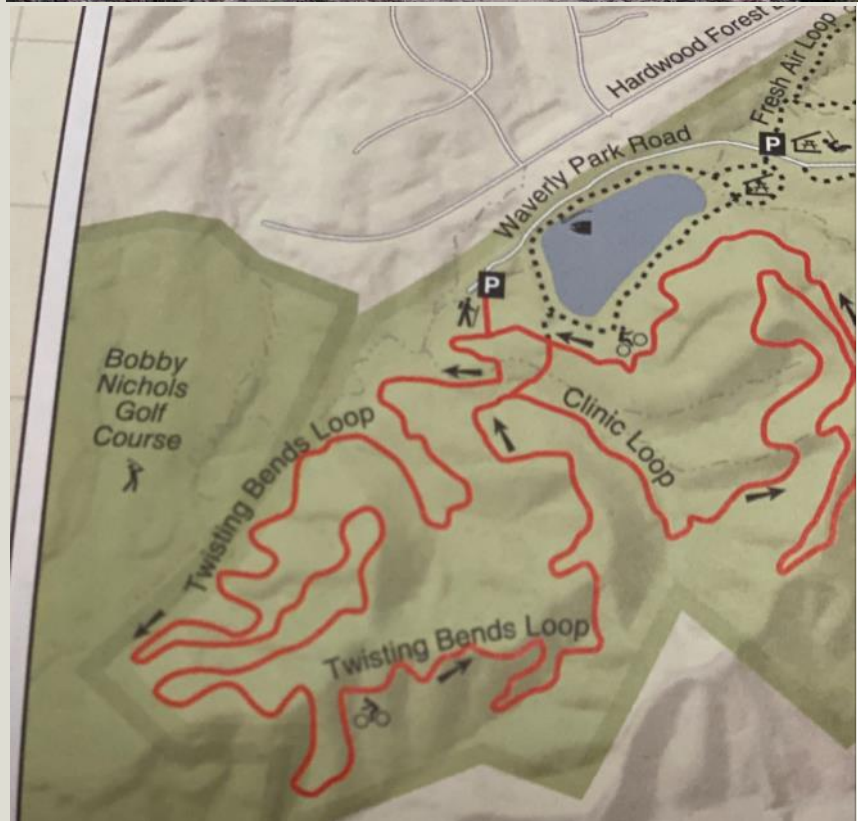

Beloved Broadway,

On November 5, we will observe All Saints Day as is our custom. This day came as a surprise my first year at Broadway, as I had never experienced anything like it before. Our church in Houston read the names of our faithful departed, and we tolled a handbell for each name, so I brought my limited previous experience with me. You might imagine my awe



the first time I witnessed All Saints Day here at Broadway. After the tolling and reading of each church member who we had lost since the previous All Saints Day, the entire congregation was invited to come forward. As you came to light candles and speak the names of your loved ones, I was moved to tears.

The next year, I lost my last living grandparent. Speaking the name of my grandmother, Melba Jean Sinclair, and lighting a candle in her memory was only a short moment—but it was a meaningful moment. Grief is like a houseguest who has overstayed their welcome. However, the more we try to ignore the beast, the louder the roar. When we host to this houseguest graciously—when we call it by name; when we acknowledge its presence; when we feed it with rituals, stories, and gratitude—then and only then when we honor our grief will the guest find what it seeks. This is why All Saints is so important to me, and why I am grateful to be in a church who honors our faithful departed in such a sacred, tender way.

This is the shortest All Saints Day list we have had seen I have been here, but it is a heavy list. 2023 has been a season of grief and trauma unlike any I have ever seen in congregational ministry. Our Stewardship Campaign theme The Seasons of Our Story has been a reminder that life goes in seasons, and we can weather whatever storm any season brings by God's grace and by our connection together.

Thank you for all of the ways you have made our church the family of God for each other in this place in 2023. Thank you for every call, card, and expression of care you have offered this year. Thank you for being the Family of God in this place, Broadway.
